Bill Summary

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. The bill creates the suicide prevention commission (commission) for the purpose of providing public and private leadership and recommendations regarding suicide prevention in Colorado. The commission will have members who represent the public and private sectors and who have experience with, or have been affected by, suicide

and suicide prevention. The department will provide administrative support to the commission. The bill requires the office of suicide prevention to include recommendations of the commission in its annual report to the general assembly and present the report in the annual SMART Act hearings.

The bill authorizes the department of public health and environment to receive gifts, grants, and donations for the costs associated with the implementation and duties of the commission.

1 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:

2 SECTION 1. In Colorado Revised Statutes, add 25-1.5-111 as

4 25-1.5-111. Suicide prevention commission - created 5 responsibilities - gifts, grants, donations - repeal. (1) THE SUICIDE
6 PREVENTION COMMISSION IS HEREBY CREATED FOR THE PURPOSE OF:

7 (a) PROVIDING PUBLIC AND PRIVATE LEADERSHIP FOR SUICIDE
8 PREVENTION AND INTERVENTION IN COLORADO;

9 (b) SETTING STATEWIDE, DATA-DRIVEN SUICIDE PREVENTION
10 PRIORITIES IN COLORADO;

11 (c) SERVING AS AN ADVISOR TO THE OFFICE OF SUICIDE
12 PREVENTION;

13 (d) ESTABLISHING AND LEADING SUBGROUPS TO SET STRATEGY
14 AND IMPLEMENTATION PLANS FOR EACH STATEWIDE SUICIDE PREVENTION
15 PRIORITY;

16 (e) PROVIDING A FORUM FOR GOVERNMENT AGENCIES,
17 COMMUNITY MEMBERS, BUSINESS LEADERS, AND LAWMAKERS TO EXAMINE
18 THE CURRENT STATUS OF SUICIDE PREVENTION AND INTERVENTION
19 POLICIES, ANALYZE THE SYSTEM'S NEAR-TERM OPPORTUNITIES AND

7 SUICIDE PREVENTION PROGRAMS AND STRATEGIES ACROSS COLORADO;

8 (h) ENSURING THAT SUICIDE PREVENTION REMAINS A STATE9 PRIORITY; AND

10 (i) ENCOURAGING THE DEVELOPMENT OF SUICIDE PREVENTION
11 PLANS AT THE LOCAL LEVEL.

(2) (a) WITHIN THIRTY DAYS AFTER THE EFFECTIVE DATE OF THIS
SECTION, THE GOVERNOR SHALL APPOINT TWO CO-CHAIRPERSONS TO THE
COMMISSION. THE TWO CO-CHAIRPERSONS SHALL APPOINT TO THE
COMMITTEE NO MORE THAN TWENTY-THREE MEMBERS, INCLUDING:

17 IN THE DEPARTMENT, WHICH OFFICE SHALL SERVE AS THE ADMINISTRATOR

23 (IV) A REPRESENTATIVE FROM K-20 EDUCATION;

24 (V) A REPRESENTATIVE FROM AN EMPLOYEE ASSISTANCE
25 PROGRAM OR A HUMAN RESOURCES DEPARTMENT FROM THE PRIVATE
26 SECTOR;

27 (VI) A REPRESENTATIVE FROM THE SUICIDE PREVENTION

2 (VII) A REPRESENTATIVE FROM THE COLORADO CHAPTER OF THE 3 AMERICAN FOUNDATION FOR SUICIDE PREVENTION; 4 (VIII) A REPRESENTATIVE FROM THE BEHAVIORAL HEALTH 5 TRANSFORMATION COUNCIL IN THE DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN SERVICES; 6 (IX) AN ACTIVE MEMBER OR VETERAN OF THE UNITED STATES 7 MILITARY WHO HAS BEEN AFFECTED BY SUICIDE: 8 (X) A REPRESENTATIVE FROM THE COLORADO YOUTH ADVISORY 9 COUNCIL: 10 (XI) A FAMILY MEMBER OF A PERSON WHO DIED BY SUICIDE; 11 (XII) A PERSON WHO HAS ATTEMPTED SUICIDE, RECOVERED, AND 12 IS NOW THRIVING; 13 (XIII) A PERSON FROM A PHILANTHROPIC FOUNDATION; 14 (XIV) A REPRESENTATIVE OF MEDICAL PROVIDERS OR FIRST 15 RESPONDERS; 16 (XV) A REPRESENTATIVE FROM THE AGRICULTURAL, RANCHING, 17 OR OIL AND GAS INDUSTRY FROM A RURAL AREA; 18 (XVI) AT LEAST TWO MEMBERS OF THE COLORADO BUSINESS 19 COMMUNITY, ONE OF WHOM REPRESENTS A RURAL AREA; 20 (XVII) ONE REPRESENTATIVE OF THE SUICIDE PREVENTION 21 NONPROFIT COMMUNITY: 22 (XVIII) A REPRESENTATIVE FROM A NONPROFIT COMMUNITY 23 SERVICE CLUB; 24 (XIX) A REPRESENTATIVE FROM AN INTERFAITH ORGANIZATION; 25 (XX) A STATE LEGISLATOR WHO HAS BEEN AFFECTED BY OR WHO 26 HAS EXPERIENCE WITH SUICIDE; AND 27 (XXI) A REPRESENTATIVE FROM THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH

2 (b)WHEN APPOINTING THE COMMISSION MEMBERS, THE 3 CO-CHAIRPERSONS SHALL ENSURE THAT THE REGIONS OF THE STATE WITH 4 HIGH SUICIDE RATES, INCLUDING RURAL AREAS, ARE REPRESENTED AND 5 THAT THE COMMISSION INCLUDES MEMBERS WITH EXPERTISE WITH GROUPS 6 ASSOCIATED WITH HIGH SUICIDE RATES AND SUICIDE ATTEMPTS, 7 INCLUDING: WORKING-AGE MEN; SENIOR ADULTS; VETERANS AND 8 ACTIVE-DUTY MILITARY PERSONNEL; LESBIAN, GAY, AND TRANSGENDER 9 YOUTHS; AND YOUTHS OF DISPROPORTIONATELY AFFECTED DIVERSITIES 10 AND GENDERS.

(c) THE MEMBERS OF THE COMMISSION SHALL SERVE WITHOUT
 COMPENSATION; EXCEPT THAT THE MEMBERS MAY SEEK REIMBURSEMENT
 FOR TRAVEL EXPENSES TO AND FROM MEETINGS OF THE COMMISSION.

14 THE DEPARTMENT SHALL PROVIDE TO THE COMMISSION (3) 15 SUPPORT THAT INCLUDES THE COORDINATION OF ALL COMMISSION 16 ACTIVITIES, INCLUDING: MEETING LOGISTICS, AGENDA DEVELOPMENT, 17 AND FOLLOW-UP; ORGANIZING AND ORIENTING COMMISSION MEMBERS; 18 WORKING CLOSELY WITH THE CO-CHAIRPERSONS TO SET PRIORITIES. 19 RECRUIT MEMBERS, OVERSEE ALL COMMISSION INITIATIVES, COORDINATE 20 ACTIVITIES, AND IMPLEMENT ANY COMMISSION-DIRECTED INITIATIVES; 21 AND ANY OTHER DUTIES ASSIGNED BY THE CO-CHAIRPERSONS. THE 22 DIRECTOR OF THE OFFICE OF BEHAVIORAL HEALTH IN THE DEPARTMENT OF 23 HUMAN SERVICES, A REPRESENTATIVE FROM THE UNIVERSITY OF 24 COLORADO DEPRESSION CENTER, AND A REPRESENTATIVE OF THE SUICIDE 25 PREVENTION COALITION OF COLORADO MAY ALSO PROVIDE SUPPORT TO 26 THE COMMISSION.

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(4) THE OFFICE OF SUICIDE PREVENTION SHALL INCLUDE THE

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RECOMMENDATIONS OF THE COMMISSION IN THE REPORT SUBMITTED
 ANNUALLY TO THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY PURSUANT TO SECTION 25-1.5-101
 AND SHALL PRESENT THE RECOMMENDATIONS AS PART OF ITS ANNUAL
 PRESENTATION TO THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY PURSUANT TO THE "STATE
 MEASUREMENT FOR ACCOUNTABLE, RESPONSIVE, TRANSPARENT
 (SMART) GOVERNMENT ACT" AS ENACTED BY HOUSE BILL 10-1119 IN
 2010.

8 (5)THE DEPARTMENT MAY ACCEPT GIFTS, GRANTS, AND 9 DONATIONS FROM PUBLIC AND PRIVATE SOURCES FOR THE DIRECT AND 10 INDIRECT COSTS ASSOCIATED WITH THE IMPLEMENTATION AND DUTIES 11 ASSOCIATED WITH THE COMMISSION. THE DEPARTMENT SHALL TRANSMIT 12 ANY GIFTS, GRANTS, AND DONATIONS IT RECEIVES TO THE STATE 13 TREASURER, WHO SHALL CREDIT THE MONEYS TO THE SUICIDE PREVENTION 14 COORDINATION CASH FUND CREATED IN SECTION 25-1.5-101 (1) (w) (II). THE FUND ALSO CONSISTS OF ANY MONEYS APPROPRIATED OR 15 16 TRANSFERRED TO THE FUND BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY FOR THE 17 PURPOSES OF THIS SECTION. THE MONEYS IN THE FUND ARE SUBJECT TO 18 ANNUAL APPROPRIATION BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY.

(6) (a) THIS SECTION IS REPEALED, EFFECTIVE SEPTEMBER 1, 2024.
(b) PRIOR TO THE REPEAL, THE DEPARTMENT OF REGULATORY
AGENCIES SHALL REVIEW THE COMMISSION PURSUANT TO SECTION
2-3-1203, C.R.S.
